SUBJECT: The main principles of civil liability for road- accidents.

## QUESTIONNAIRE

- 1)- Does your legal system regulate civil liability for road accidents with reference to a fault of the defendant?

  If yes, does your law simply refer to negligence of the concerned person, or to imprudence, unskilfulness, violation of statutes or regulations?
- 2)- Is negligence determined by the standard of conduct of the ordinary prudent man under similar circumstances (culpa levis)?

  Are there any cases in which even a slight fault can determine civil liability for a road accident (culpa levissima)?
- 3)- Is the burden of evidence always placed upon the victim of an accident?

  Is civil liability imposed without fault in any case?

  Are there any cases in which a person involved in a road accident must prove to be innocent?
- 4) How is civil liability regulated in case of a road collision between:
  - a) two or more vehicles ?
  - b) a vehicle and an animal?
- 5)- What are the consequences of a contributory negligence of the victim in a road accident?

  If a negligent driver is injured in a road accident, is his liability modified or excluded?
- 6)- Is liability attributed to the vehicle owner for negligence or willful misconduct of the operator?

  How does your legal system regulate the liability of Government agencies arising from the operation of a publicly owned vehicle?
- 7) Does your law establish a joint liability of:
  - a) employers, for damages caused by their servants and employees to third parties, in road accidents occurred during the performance of their job?
  - b) parents or guardians, for damages caused by children or mentally ill persons who are in their custody?
  - c) teachers, for damages caused by the pupils who are placed under their surveillance?
- 8)- How does your law regulate liability with respect to the persons transported in a motor vehicle?

  What is the rule with respect to gratuitous guest passengers?
- 9)- What are the elements of recovery that can be considered in a personal injury action (loss of time and wages, medical expenses, future losses, loss of earning capacity, etc.)?

  Can the victim get compensation from the pain and suffering tha has resulted from the injury?
- 10)-In cases where an injured person dies in a road accident, who is entitled to claim damages?
- ll)-Does your law establish that mechanically propelled vehicles shall be covered by insurance against the risks of road accidents (injury, death, property damage) If yes, what are the damages covered by such insurance?
- 12)-Has your Country established a special fund to pay allowances to the victims of road accidents (or their heirs), when the person who caused the damage is unknown or is unable to restore it?
