

LENGTH OF STAGES OF THE CIVIL PROCEDURE

➤ AIM: Take stock of the situation in countries regarding deadlines and delays in 7 stages of the civil procedure

STATE OF PLAY: preliminary comparative analysis examined based on information from pilot courts from 8 countries

LENGTH OF STAGES OF THE CIVIL PROCEDURE

CONTENT: description and analysis of steps: serving documents, filing a response to teh legal action, preliminary hearing, issuing written judgments, filling an appeal

NEXT STEPS: detailed analysis based on collection of comprehensive data (interviews and legislative research)
